

### **Catholic School Matters** Exploring STEAM



Young students need time to explore, create and innovate. They are naturally interested in science as they are very curious, persistent, and creative. At the Academy, we encourage our youngest students in grades PreK-4 to 3rd to question the world around them by supplementing their regular science curriculum with a STEAM class each week.

STEAM is STEM with the arts added. Including the arts into the study of Science, Technology, Engineering and Math is a natural fit because STEAM's emphasis is creativity and design. Our STEAM teacher, Ms. Teresa Bonner, has been guiding our youngest students with various fun projects that allows them to critically think, ask questions, and work on problem-solving skills. Each class starts with a question, sometimes supplemented with a video, and then a hands-on project. Students have learned the basics of chemical reactions when they made "potions" a/l/a Harry Potter style around Halloween. The students watched the reaction of vinegar and baking soda when mixed and learned the properties of an acid and base. Ms. Bonner also challenged students to create a bridge using only five pieces of paper and books. The students had to ensure the bridge was strong enough to support the weight of several pennies. PreK and Kindergarten learned the basics of shapes and how different shapes can be used to build things. They built a twodimensional fire engine using pre-cut shapes, each shaped forming a part of the fire engine, circles for the wheels, squares for windows and doors, etc. They also created triangles out of marshmallows and toothpicks.

As each project is completed, students complete a journal to record their question, observations, predictions, and results, introducing them to the process of the scientific method. STEAM is a fun way to encourage our youngest students to learn about the wonders of the world.
