Celebrating Traditions



This school year has been quite different, more than any in the 70 year history of the Academy. From shields around desks, daily health checks, and masks, our students are experiencing a fundamental change in the school day. Understanding the need for normalcy, our faculty and staff have worked tirelessly to ensure our cherished school traditions continue.

Pinwheels for Peace is one of the traditions that our students look forward to every year. St. Bartholomew students in pre -kindergarten through fourth grade took part in an annual international art and literacy project, "Pinwheels for Peace", to celebrate International Day of Peace on September 21st. The students planted pinwheels in front of the Convent in a culmination of a week spent focusing on peace and what that means to the students. Pinwheels for Peace" is an art installation project started in 2005 by two art teachers from Florida. The students were very happy to craft pinwheels and talk about what peace means to them.

Gathering each month for First Friday Mass has been a tradition since the school was founded in 1950. At present, only half the school may gather in church at one time and the students are having a prayer service, instead of celebrating mass. During October's prayer service, the Academy announced a new scholarship in partnership with the State Farm Scotch Plains office. This monthly scholarship will be awarded to an S.B.A. student who is recommended by the faculty and meets the following criteria: Is a practicing Roman Catholic, in good academic standing, and demonstrates acts of kindness within your community. The award of \$300 will go towards their 2021/2022 school tuition. This month Zoe Badilla was selected as the first recipient of the scholarship and was recognized at our First Friday Prayer Service. Congratulations to Zoe and thank you to Jason Bartlett from State Farm for sponsoring this scholarship program.

Confirmation - Important Information

We are looking forward to Confirmation! Please take note of the following important information:

Virtual Zoom Practices:

Fri., Oct. 16th @ 6:30 - 7:30pm (for that weekend's Masses) Zoom links will be sent the morning of practice. Candidates, sponsors & parents should attend the virtual practice. The Zoom practice will be extremely important for everyone in light of safety guidelines and the reception of the Sacrament of Confirmation.

Covid -19 Restrictions Impact on Reserved Seating & Sponsors:

Every effort is being made to maintain the health & safety of all families and participants at the Confirmation Masses, and to comply with the guidelines of the archdiocese and the state. Each candidate will be seated in his/her own pew with four additional family household members. All people who will be sitting in the pew, including the candidate, must meet Covid-19 requirements. If the sponsor is not a member of the candidate's household, *a parent will need to serve as the proxy for the sponsor*. This does not change who the sponsor is; the sponsor's name will be recorded in the sacrament record book and retains the important faith formation role he/ she has accepted.

Additional Unreserved Seating for Confirmation Masses: For Saturday Masses, you will be able to sign up four additional family members/friends to attend the Mass. This seating will be in the side sections of the church. Anyone you sign up must meet the Covid-19 requirements. Those whom you sign up: 1) must wear a facemask and practice social distancing at IHM; 2) should not have been exposed to anyone with Covid-19; 3) should be in good heath; 4) would need to have complied with the 14 day self quarantine requirement if they have traveled out of NJ to a travel advisory state or will be visiting from a travel advisory state prior to attending the Confirmation Mass. We will be relying on each family to monitor whom they invite. Thank you for your cooperation to keep everyone safe. A Sign Up Genius will be emailed to you early next week which you may use to sign up four add'l guests for Saturday Confirmations. For Sunday Confirmation Masses, families will be able to sign up additional guests (who meet Covid-19 requirements) by using the regular parish Sign Up Genius that is emailed each week by the parish. If you are not getting these emails, contact the office at <u>office@ihmparish.net</u> or 889-2100.

Livestreaming and Recording of Masses:

All Confirmation Masses will be livestreamed and recorded. through the IHM parish Facebook page so other family members and friends may view the Sacrament of Confirmation. I am sensitive that some families may not wish to be recorded. I am sorry that there will be no way around this at the Confirmation Masses Please let Mary Clinton or Fr. Mike know if you do not wish to be recorded so we can make other arrangements.
