Jesus is not condemning the religious practice of the Pharisee, nor is He condoning the malicious business practices of the tax collector. Rather, He is commenting on their approach to God in their personal prayer. The Pharisee approaches God with a sense of self righteousness, that he is good and is entitled to God's love. The Tax Collector knows that he is a sinful man and does not deserve anything from God. Yet he gives himself over to God's mercy, rather than expecting God's blessing. Jesus reminds His disciples, and us, that the correct way to approach God, and each other, is with humility and reverence, not pride and self righteousness. Yet, how often do we follow in the footsteps of the Pharisee? God wants to show us His love and wants us to experience His presence in our lives. When we think and act in a prideful and self righteous way, towards God and towards one another, we prevent ourselves from experiencing that love and presence in our lives. When we approach God and one another with humility and reverence, we open our hearts and minds to the love and presence of Christ in our lives and in others.

Current Events:



Linking the Past to the Present

Educating young people to become informed, thoughtful citizens is an integral part of a student's development. Mrs. Conroy, the Academy middle school history teacher, incorporates current events into the curriculum to help start building the students' capacities for critical thinking, emotional engagement, moral reflection, and civic mindfulness.

Using various educational materials, the middle school students at the Academy make a connection between the history they are studying and today. Each history class begins with a review of CNN Student News, where the major news stories of the day, as well as human interest stories, are conveyed to them on their level. After watching each episode, time is spent reviewing the topics discussed. Each week the students play News Brain, a countrywide online quiz, where students compete over the issues in the news each week. They also receive a subscription to Scholastic News' Junior Scholastic, a bi-weekly magazine that features in-depth current events, geographic activities, connections to US and world history, as well as text analysis activities. Finally, each student is required to complete five news articles summaries over the course of each semester. The students must identify the type of news - local, national, or world, and explain why the article is newsworthy. They also have to highlight the critical parts in the article, such as the who, what, where, and when.

These classroom tools and assignments not only enable middle school students to see beyond the world they live in, but they provide them with critical note taking skills, map skills, and reading comprehension that will serve them in high school and beyond. We are very proud that the history curriculum of the Academy incorporates current events into Ancient Civilization and US History.
