Middle School Science



Science stimulates a child's imagination, allows them to explore the world in deeper ways and develop problem solving skills. The middle school science curriculum at the Academy has been redeveloped this year to further enhance our student's knowledge base, acquire critical thinking skills, and inspire a love of learning.

Mrs. Michelle Brooks, the Academy middle school Science teacher, is using the KnowAtom curriculum to bring the students year-long, hands on discovery of science concepts. The Next Generation curriculum combines science with engineering as the students' study nine, month long units. These units investigate Earth and space, life, physical science and technology/engineering. Starting in 5th grade, each year builds on the last. By the time the students have finished 8th grade, they are fully prepared for Physical Science, Physics, Chemistry and Biology in high school.

All the students started the year reviewing the 8-step scientific process. As they start a topic, they review a Concept Map, which summarizes the theme of the unit, as well as builds the students vocabulary. Recently, the 7th grade learned about endothermic and exothermic energy and conducted an experiment where they observed the chemical reaction that occurs when vinegar and baking soda are combined. Eighth grade performed the same experiment, but those students focused on what happened to the vinegar and baking soda on a molecular level. Our remote learners participated as Mrs. Brooks was able to use a document camera hovering over the test environment. Detailed lab notes and reports are used by the students to record their data and understanding of the concepts. We are very excited to introduce this new curriculum to the students!
