Using History to Find Their Place

Giving children a sense of their place in the world and empowering them with the skills they need to relate to others is an important feature of a grammar school social studies curriculum. Mrs. Lynda England, the Academy's fourth and fifth grade social studies teacher, has already utilized several creative projects to help the students start making those important connections.

Fourth grade spends the year in social studies focused on the state of New Jersey. The students start the year learning the topography of the state, then move onto the early explorers, such as Henry Hudson, Cornelius May, and Giovanni da Verrazzano. As an interesting project designed to enhance their understanding of our state's culture and heritage, the students recently researched the official symbols of New Jersey, including the state flower, insect, motto, fruit, and ship. They then created posters explaining each item.

Fifth grade is spending the year studying the Americas. They started with an overview of the explorers and engaged in a research based discussion on the negative and positive impact explorers had on the land and the native population. They are currently studying Native Americans and how the land they lived on determined their livelihood and culture. For instance, in the plains, farming was easier, yet in the woods of the Northeast, trapping and hunting prevailed. To better understand their way of life, the students completed a research project related to one of the Native American groups. After selecting a group, each student had to research that groups culture and choose to make something from that group, such as a totem pole, model of a home, display of food or an everyday object the group used. They then presented their findings to their classmates. The details of social studies may be lost as we graduate into the adult world, but the foundations of geography, history, politics, and anthropology are crucial to a child's education.
