#### Middle School Literature

The goal of the middle school literature program is to Inspire a love of reading and to equip students with the necessary reading, writing, speaking, and listening skills for high school and beyond. Mrs. Lynda England, the Academy literature teacher for grades 5-8, has been creating lessons and utilizing various platforms to keep the Academy students engaged and on task.

Fifth grade recently focused on 'sequencing' and completed two projects that also gave the students a chance to work on their culinary skills. The students had to figure out and explain the steps to cook a turkey and to make a homemade pizza. Sixth and Seventh grade learned that reading myths, such as "Flight of Icarus", provides insight into different cultures, human behavior, and enriches the imagination. Prior to reading the story, the students did a WebQuest on the Greek gods. They will be using all they learned about myths to write their own myth over the next few weeks.

Eighth grade combined history with reading by reading "Raymond's Run", a story set during the Harlem Renaissance. The students first learned about the intellectual, social, and artistic period that started in Harlem in the 1920's. While reading the story, the class looked at story elements, particularly how the author develops the story through the first person narrative of the main character, Hazel.

Using these various lesson plans builds the communication skills of our pre-teen and young teenage students, and allows the students to explore their creative side. These skills will prepare them well for high school and will enable them to achieve in any subject area.
