In listening to Mark's description of John the Baptist in today's Gospel, his community would have called to mind the prophet Elijah (John's clothing and food are similar) whose coming heralded the coming of the Messiah, the exodus, the exile, and the return of the people of Israel to the promised land. He is indicating that Jesus will be the one who is to come, the Messiah, the Christ. He also helps them, and us, to understand what we must do in order to prepare for this great event. We must make straight the way, remove the mountains and valleys that are obstacle to the Lord's coming into our lives. One sure way to do this is by recognizing our own sinfulness, seeking God's mercy and then allowing that mercy to transform us as the people did with John the Baptist.

In confessing our sins we are no longer held back, we become free to love and receive love, the obstacles are removed and our hearts become open to the presence of Christ in our lives. We are better able to rejoice with awe at the coming of our Lord rather than fear and trembling. We hear the good news of God's salvation in Jesus Christ and experience the comfort of God's love more profoundly.

Mass Update in Accordance with COVID-19 Guidelines


All Masses are now celebrated publicly in church with COVID 19 protocols. The 8:30 am daily Mass and the Sunday 10:00 am Mass will continue to be livestreamed on Facebook & on our website: www.ihmparish.net.

Remember the obligation to attend the Sunday Eucharist remains suspended until further notice. IHM will continue to livestream our Masses. In charity and love for our parishioners and clergy, please keep in mind the following protocols:

- In accord with national, state and local health directives, those who show symptoms of COVID-19 or who have been exposed to an infected person are not permitted to enter the church for 14 days.
- Those who are at risk because of an underlying health issue or who are 60 or older are strongly encouraged to avoid the risks posed by attendance at public celebrations of the Mass.
- Masks must be worn while in the church. Hand sanifizer is available throughout the church, please use it when entering and exiting.
- Our church has been sanitized and is cleaned on a regular basis.

Giving Thanks & Giving Back

Service to others is the hallmark of a Catholic Education. During this time of Covid- 19, and while maintaining social distance, the students of St. Bartholomew Academy are finding ways to give back.

St. Bartholomew Boy Scout Troop 203 and Cub Scout Pack 103 participated in Scouting for Food in early November. For two weekends, the scouts dropped off over 700 bags in the neighborhoods around the Academy and picked up over 110 bags. These donations were given to the St. Bartholomew Parish Food Pantry and the Fanwood Presbyterian Church Food Pantry. Later in the month, the whole school collected non-perishable food and other sought-after items, such as paper towels and toilet paper for the St. Bartholomew Parish Food Pantry. Recently, our 8th grade students participated in the Boxes of Joy project. Boxes of Joy is an annual Christmas gift ministry facilitated by Cross Catholic Outreach. The students chose a boy or girl and filled a shoe box size gift box with toys and other gifts that will be sent to children living in extreme poverty. The students are also looking forward to participating in the St. Bartholomew Parish wide 'Stuff a Stocking' program which benefits Overlook Hospital, Mercy House, Family Promise, and the St. Vincent De Paul Pantry.

During the prayer service, Ms. Harrigan, the Academy Principal, announced the November recipient of the St. Bartholomew State Farm Eagle Scholarship. This month, 5th grader Emily Langemen was selected as the recipient of the scholarship. Congratulations to Emily and thank you to Jason Bartlett from State Farm for sponsoring this scholarship program. This monthly scholarship is awarded to an S.B.A. student who is recommended by the faculty and meets the following criteria: Is a practicing Roman Catholic, in good academic standing, and demonstrates acts of kindness within your community. The award of \$300 will go towards their 2021/2022 school tuition.
