#### Announcement:

The Church is open for private prayer from 6.45 am to noon on weekdays. Please follow social distancing protocols. Masks must be worn at all times.

Sign-up for weekend masses opens mid-week -subject to directives from Archdiocese of Newark - 10 am mass will continue to be livestreamed. Please note that you will need to reserve in advance for attending weekend mass - details for sign-up posted on the website.

Adoration Chapel is now open – sign-up required – please see bulletin or website for details. **Masks must be worn at all times in the Chapel and social distancing must be maintained.**

For those of us who continue to celebrate Mass in our homes virtually it is good to remember that Jesus is truly present whenever 2 or 3 are gathered in his name, even if at a distance. There is also the idea of the “Domestic Church”, an understanding that is born of baptism that the family is the first and perhaps most encountered way of living out our lives of faith. he sent his servants to the tenants to obtain his produce.

but they treated them in the same way.

Finally, he sent his son to them, thinking,

'They will respect my son.'

But when the tenants saw the son, they said to one another,
