- In accord with national, state and local health directives, those who show symptoms of COVID-19 or who have been exposed to an infected person are not permitted to enter the church for 14 days. Those who are at risk because of an underlying health issue or who are 60 or older are strongly encouraged
- to avoid the risks posed by attendance at public celebrations of the Mass.
- Masks must be worn while in the church. Hand sanitizer is available throughout the church, please use it when entering and exiting.
- Our church has been sanitized and is cleaned on a regular basis.

### **Catholic Schools Week**

Every January, Catholic Schools across America celebrate Catholic Schools Week. This year's theme was "Catholic Schools: Faith, Excellence, Service". Despite Covid-19 and a blizzard the Academy found ways to celebrate with Mass, our annual Open House, and other activities for students, families, parishioners, and members of the community. Through these events, the students and faculty were able to focus on the value Catholic education provides to young people and its contributions to our church, our communities, and our nation.

Our Academy started the week on Sunday, with Fr. John Paladino presiding over the noon mass. Students from the middle school also spoke at masses over the weekend, sharing their experience at the Academy and the impact it has had on them and their families. After the Noon Mass, the Academy hosted the annual Open House. Due to Covid-19, the Open House was held by appointment only, but the individualized setting gave prospective parents a great opportunity to learn about the school and programs.

With in-person classes canceled the first few days of the week due to the snow, the students persevered and condensed the various charitable drives, service projects, and activities into two days. They collected food for the St. Bartholomew Food Pantry, raised money for the Tuition Angel Program, created gratitude cards for the faculty and staff, had an art contest of national symbols, and a school wide bingo game. Fr. John and Fr. David had a virtual visit to the school on Thursday to talk about vocations. The week ended with the return of First Friday Mass. Despite being a shortened week it was a great deal of fun and demonstrated that our Academy is a community of faith, excellence, and service.
