Spiritual Reflection 6th Sunday in Ordinary Time

"Brothers and sisters, whether you eat or drink, or whatever you do, do everything for the glory of God." - 1 Corinthians 10:31

Do a quick check of your priorities. Where does God rank in that list? If He's not first, you have some work to do. Putting God first in everything helps us from putting other "gods" (like our pride, ego, money and possessions) before God. Before making a decision, ask yourself, "Am I doing this for the glory of God or for the glory of me?"



Archdiocese of Newark 2021 Lenten Regulations

1. The days of both Fast and Abstinence during Lent are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily His Resurrection. The other Fridays of Lent are days of Abstinence.

On a day of Fast, only one (1) full meal is permitted and two (2) smaller meals, which, if added together, would not exceed the main meal in quantity.

Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast. On a day of Abstinence, no meat may be eaten. Those who have reached the age of 14 are obliged by the law of Abstinence.

- 2. The obligation to observe the laws of Fast and Abstinence "substantially," or as a whole, is a serious obligation.
- 3. Fridays of the year outside of Lent are designated as days of penance, but each individual may substitute for the traditional abstinence from meat some other practice of voluntary self-denial as penance.
- 4. The time for fulfilling the Paschal Precept (Easter Duty*) extends from the First Sunday of Lent, February 21, 2021 to The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, May 30, 2021.

*Canon 920 §1. All the faithful, after they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, are bound by the obligation of receiving Communion at least once a year.

Mass in Accordance with COVID-19 Guidelines

All Masses are now celebrated publicly in church with COVID 19 protocols. The 8:30 am daily Mass and the Sunday 10:00 am Mass will continue to be livestreamed on Facebook & on our website: www.ihmparish.net.

Remember the obligation to attend the Sunday Eucharist remains suspended until further notice. IHM will continue to livestream our Masses. In charity and love for our parishioners and clergy, please keep in mind the following protocols:

- In accord with national, state and local health directives, those who show symptoms of COVID-19 or who
- have been exposed to an infected person are not permitted to enter the church for 14 days. Those who are at risk because of an underlying health issue or who are 60 or older are strongly encouraged to avoid the risks posed by attendance at public celebrations of the Mass.
- Masks must be worn while in the church. Hand sanitizer is available throughout the church, please use it when entering and exiting.
- Our church has been sanitized and is cleaned on a regular basis.

Fun with Math in Third Grade

Third grade is when students make the transition from the early childhood education program to grammar school. As their guide, Mrs. Maria Stetin, the Academy third grade teacher, leads and encourages them through various fun projects that develop educational skills, foster social development, and build confidence.

When you think of third grade math, multiplication always comes to mind. But a unit in geometry makes a welcome break from all the memorization. The third grade students recently pivoted from multiplication to geometry and line segments. A fun line segment project was a cross curricular one with science. The students learned about popular constellations in our solar system, created their own constellation, and then wrote a story about it. The final project in the geometry unit was called "I See Geometry in...". The students were asked to search for geometric shapes around their homes, school, and activities. Projects were quite varied, including finding geometry in ice skating, basketball, the kitchen, and dance. After identifying the various shapes and geometric terms, the students made posters and explained what they found with visual references. Both projects were great ways to bring math alive, for the students to see the relevance math has in their everyday lives, and a way to refresh and get ready for more multiplication.
