

Spiritual Reflection 2nd Sunday of Lent



"'Here I am!' he answered." - Genesis 22:11

It is easy to say, "Here I am, Lord," when we are kneeling in church. But how easy is it to say "Here I am, Lord," when a neighbor needs our help, when we are invited to join a parish ministry, or when we are asked to provide financial support? Often times we are called when it's not convenient for us. Discipleship is not always easy, most of the time it will make us uncomfortable and vulnerable.

Archdiocese of Newark 2021 Lenten Regulations

1. The days of both Fast and Abstinence during Lent are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily His Resurrection. The other Fridays of Lent are days of Abstinence.

On a day of Fast, only one (1) full meal is permitted and two (2) smaller meals, which, if added together, would not exceed the main meal in quantity.

Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast. On a day of Abstinence, no meat may be eaten. Those who have reached the age of 14 are obliged by the law of Abstinence.

- 2. The obligation to observe the laws of Fast and Abstinence "substantially," or as a whole, is a serious obligation.
- 3. Fridays of the year outside of Lent are designated as days of penance, but each individual may substitute for the traditional abstinence from meat some other practice of voluntary self-denial as penance.
- 4. The time for fulfilling the Paschal Precept (Easter Duty*) extends from the First Sunday of Lent, February 21, 2021 to The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, May 30, 2021.

*Canon 920 §1. All the faithful, after they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, are bound by the obligation of receiving Communion at least once a year.

Mass in Accordance with COVID-19 Guidelines

All Masses are now celebrated publicly in church with COVID 19 protocols. The 8:30 am daily Mass and the Sunday 10:00 am Mass will continue to be livestreamed on Facebook & on our website: www.ihmparish.net.

Remember the obligation to attend the Sunday Eucharist remains suspended until further notice. IHM will continue to livestream our Masses. In charity and love for our parishioners and clergy, please keep in mind the following protocols:

- In accord with national, state and local health directives, those who show symptoms of COVID-19 or who
- have been exposed to an infected person are not permitted to enter the church for 14 days. Those who are at risk because of an underlying health issue or who are 60 or older are strongly encouraged to avoid the risks posed by attendance at public celebrations of the Mass.
- Masks must be worn while in the church. Hand sanitizer is available throughout the church, please use it when entering and exiting.
- Our church has been sanitized and is cleaned on a regular basis.

Space is limited as social distancing guidelines are still in place and must be followed. Reservations must be made to attend mass through our website or by calling the office at (908) 889-2100. Middle school is an exciting time for students, it's full of change and questions. Reading novels and poetry in middle school gives students the opportunity to develop empathy and better understanding of others, and to explore the world around them. Students at the Academy have been reading some wonderful books and exploring the world of poetry.

5th grade has been reading a classic book about friendship, *The Bridge to Terabithia*. They learned about story element, character development, cause and effect, and making predictions. They also discussed how their own experiences help them relate to the characters.

6th grade read the Twilight Zone's *The Monsters are Due on Maple Street* as a play. As they read it aloud, they learned about how dialogue advances the plot, conflict resolution, and how fear can affect a crowd of people. Students then compared and contrasted the original Twilight Zone television episode with the play. Soon, the class will start reading the novel *Wonder*. They are looking forward to leveraging the close reading skills they are developing and applying it to a non-fiction work.

Students in 7th grade recently completed a poetry project. Reading and analyzing poetry can seem difficult and intimidating for many students. After selecting a poet and three poems by their chosen author, the students utilized the TP—FASTT (Title, Paraphrase — Figurative language, Attitude, Shift, Title, and Theme) sequence to analyze the poem. This framework gives the students a useful process to analyze poetry. They examine subject, purpose, and audience through this method and start to enjoy reading poetry. They also completed a biography on the author. To complete the unit, the class will have a poetry reading and each student read a favorite poem aloud in class.

The 8th grade students are getting ready to read a choice of dystopian novels. The students can choose from *The Hunger Games, Maze Runner or Divergent*. These types of novels encourage students to start to think about philosophical questions and reflect on society. They will break up into study groups as they read and analyze the books. They will then watch the movies that were created from the books and compare and contrast them.
