

Each account is a way of affirming that Jesus' final physical departure was a transition leading from the glory of the resurrection to the mission of the Church empowered by the Holy Spirit. That continuing mission is our mission as well. Empowered by the Holy Spirit and nourished by the Body and Blood of Christ, we too are called to proclaim the Good News just as the early disciples. The accounts urge us not upward but forward bringing the Gospel to the ends of the earth. Peace.

Archdiocese of Newark 2021 Lenten Regulations

1. The days of both Fast and Abstinence during Lent are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily His Resurrection. The other Fridays of Lent are days of Abstinence.

On a day of Fast, only one (1) full meal is permitted and two (2) smaller meals, which, if added together, would not exceed the main meal in quantity.

Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast. On a day of Abstinence, no meat may be eaten. Those who have reached the age of 14 are obliged by the law of Abstinence.

- 2. The obligation to observe the laws of Fast and Abstinence "substantially," or as a whole, is a serious obligation.
- 3. Fridays of the year outside of Lent are designated as days of penance, but each individual may substitute for the traditional abstinence from meat some other practice of voluntary self-denial as penance.
- 4. The time for fulfilling the Paschal Precept (Easter Duty*) extends from the <u>First Sunday of Lent</u>, <u>February 21, 2021 to The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity</u>, May 30, 2021.

*Canon 920 §1. All the faithful, after they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, are bound by the obligation of receiving Communion at least once a year.

Mass in Accordance with COVID-19 Guidelines

All Masses are now celebrated publicly in church with COVID 19 protocols. The 8:30 am daily Mass and the Sunday 10:00 am Mass will continue to be livestreamed on Facebook & on our website: www.ihmparish.net.

Remember the obligation to attend the Sunday Eucharist remains suspended until further notice. IHM will continue to livestream our Masses. In charity and love for our parishioners and clergy, please keep in mind the following protocols:

- In accord with national, state and local health directives, those who show symptoms of COVID-19 or who have been exposed to an infected person are not permitted to enter the church for 14 days.
 Those who are at risk because of an underlying health issue or who are 60 or older are strongly encouraged
- Those who are at risk because of an underlying health issue or who are 60 or older are strongly encouraged to avoid the risks posed by attendance at public celebrations of the Mass.
- Masks must be worn while in the church. Hand sanitizer is available throughout the church, please use it
 when entering and exiting.
- Our church has been sanitized and is cleaned on a regular basis.

Space is limited as social distancing guidelines are still in place and must be followed. Reservations must be made to attend mass through our website or by calling the office at (908) 889-2100. Honoring the Blessed Mother

The month of May is devoted to the Blessed Mother at the Academy, and the students honor Mary in various ways.

Last year, due to the pandemic and fully remote learning, the Academy was not able to have May Crowing at the school. Thankfully, this year, the students were able to gather for First Friday Mass and have a May Crowning Ceremony. Our second graders processed to the statue of the Blessed Mother and laid flowers at her feet. Two of our eighth graders then crowned Mary.

Prek-3 and Prek-4 had a prayer service and procession to visit the statue of Mary in front of the convent. The students sang the Hail Mary and "O Mary We Crown Thee with Blossoms Today." Prek-3 also crafted a decade of the rosary out of beads and decorated a picture of Mary with tissue paper. PreK-4 made banners for Mary and the students will take turns crowning the Blessed Mother in their classroom.

The middle school students will be studying the life of the Blessed Mother and her impact on the world. The sixth grade will have a research assignment where they will pick one of the Blessed Mother's titles; such as Our Lady of Lourdes, Our Lady of Fatima, Our Lady of Knock. They will research how and why she was given those titles. The seventh grade will reflect on the qualities of Mary and they will be challenged to write about a person in their life who emulates those qualities and serves as a "Modern Mary."
